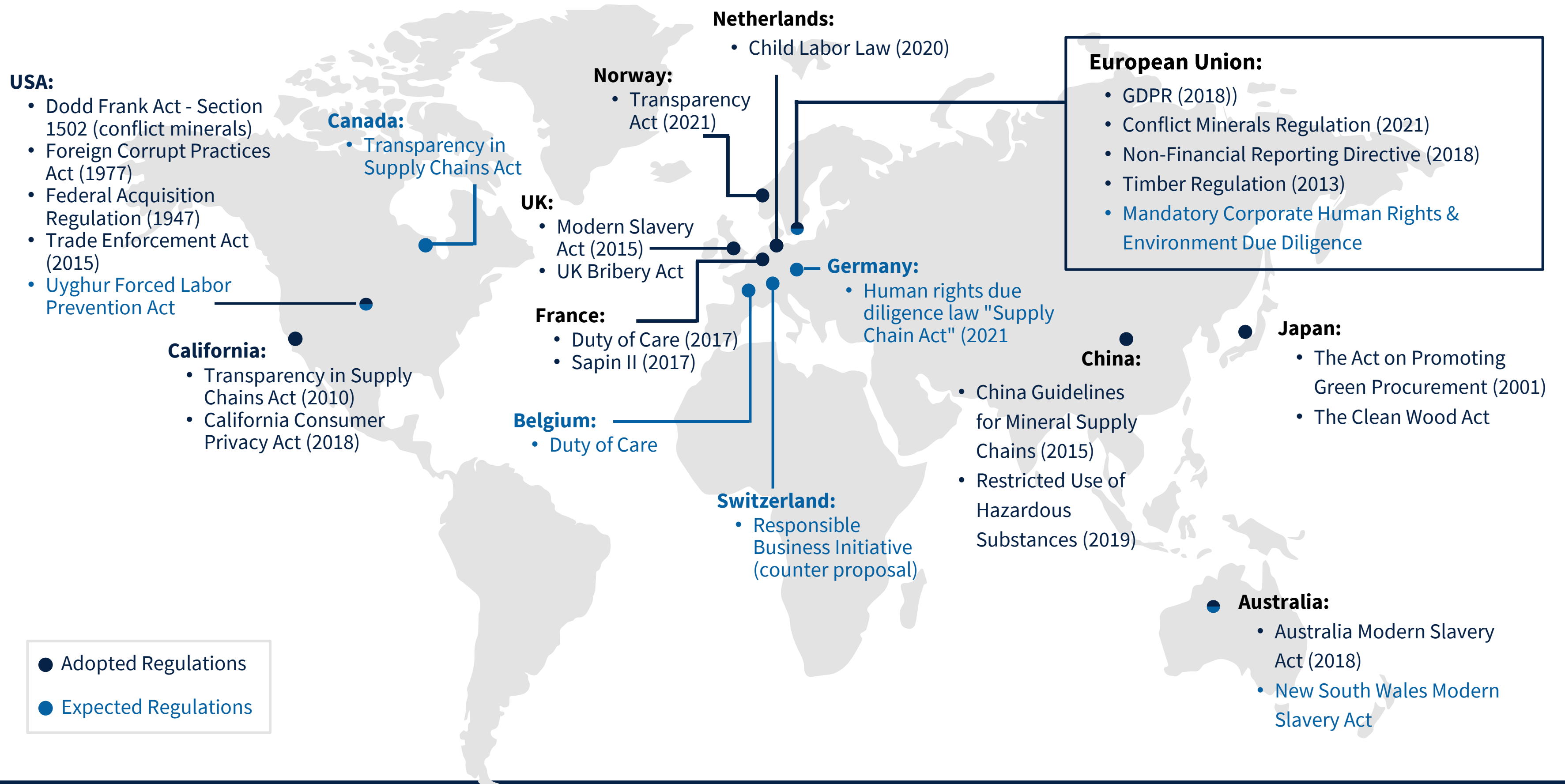


Worldwide Regulations Related to Supply Chain Due Diligence



What this means for you

- Any company importing into the US or the EU could be subject to detention if the goods are considered high-risk based on category and country of origin. Regulations are expected to apply across industries, from food/ag to textiles, semiconductors, chemicals and more.
- Following best practices for supply chain due diligence makes it possible to know whether you are at risk before a shipment is flagged by customs.
- Robust due diligence also equips you to respond to any government-mandated query and provide assurance that either (a) a shipment does not contain high-risk merchandise or (b) the shipment does contain high-risk merchandise, but robust processes are in place to prove that these were not produced using forced labor, or while contributing to environmental risk such as deforestation
